“Of all the people who work in a school, teachers and librarians are the heart of the place.”

The above is a quote from an impassioned letter that Jane Yolen wrote to John Deasey, Superintendent of Los Angeles Schools. Jane, who lives in Massachusetts, is the author of over 300 books, many of them top award winners, and a strong advocate of reading and literacy.

Hector Tobar, columnist for the *Los Angeles Times*, has described the ordeal many school librarians have faced, as they are interrogated about the worth of their work and their positions. He writes, “Librarians are the original information aggregators. It’s a job they’ve been doing since ancient times, from scrolls and parchment to virtual books and digital databases and...part of a school librarian’s job is to teach ‘digital literacy’.”

It’s time for supporters of children’s books and reading to let John Deasey and Board Members of the Los Angeles Unified School District know how important school librarians and aides are to the education of the children in our city.
